## Rules for Competition

All exhibits presented for competition must be competitor's own work.
2 No competitor shall be allowed to stage more than one entry in one class except Section A (1-31), Sections B and C where two entries will be allowed. Any contravening of this Rule, the entrant will be disqualified.

Except where stated, Society's Vases only will be used. Section A exhibitors must provide own tray. Display Boxes (approx $8 " \times 8 "$ x $2 "$ ) can be supplied by the Society in Classes 47, 48 and 65.

The Society shall not be responsible for loss or damage to any article.

Articles exhibited remain the property of the exhibitor but must not be removed from Show until after 3.45 pm . Articles for disposal by the Committee as they see fit may be identified by means of a coloured sticker attached to competition labels, with any profit going to Society funds.
6 An auction of agreed produce and articles will take place following the prize raffle. The Committee reserve the right to dispose of produce items (except industrial) which have not been removed from the Show at the appropriate time.

Articles in Section H (Industrial) must not be re-entered in subsequent Shows of the Society. Committee reserve the right to refuse any article offered for Show.

The Village Hall will be open on Friday evening (before Show Day) from 6:30pm until $8: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ for the reception of exhibits in ALL CLASSES. During this time the Kitchen area WILL be available for the preparation of Vegetable, Flower and Rose Exhibits. The Village Hall will be open on Show Day from 8:00am until 9:30am for the reception of exhibits in ALL CLASSES. During this time the Kitchen area WILL NOT be available for the preparation of exhibits. These will need to be prepared prior to delivery to the Village Hall. The Kitchen, at this time, will be being cleaned in preparation for the commencement of catering preparations.

9 Each Exhibit must bear Official Competition Label (SECURELY ATTACHED) with Name and Annual Membership number written in the concealed section and the Section and Class in the exposed section. The Committee shall NOT be responsible for mistakes due to wrongly placed exhibits, incorrect information or insecurely attached labels. Such labels may be obtained from Committee Members at 25p each. Children's Section Entries are free of charge.

10 In the event of a tie, the Trophy shall be awarded to the Competitor with most firsts. If equal firsts, the Trophy will be shared - six months each.

11 In all matters relating to the awarding of prizes the Judges' decision shall be final.

## Hints for the Flower Show

## FLORAL TERMS

"Border Bunch" can be Annuals and/or Perennials of any kind but do not include flowering shrubs.

Carnations should not have split calyxes (the green part beneath the petals).

Gladioli should not have too much bare stem above the vase. The number of blooms even if not fully out is what counts.

Pansies can be plain or "cat's face" whereas Violas have lines.

Hybrid Tea Roses are those with one bloom on the stem.

Floribundas are multi-bloomed.
Judges look for those roses that are high centred and many petalled, with healthy leaves and no blemishes.

Pot Plants should be presented for the show with the dead flowers and leaves removed and without aphids.

Annuals are those flowers which are sown and bloom in one season, e.g. Asters, Marigolds (African and French), Godetia, Larkspur, Clarkia or Scotch Marigold (if "double" then no centre should be seen). Although actually Perennial and sometimes treated as Biennial, Antirrhinums are accepted as Annuals.

Perennials are those plants which grow year after year but the ones that die down and reappear in Spring are known as Herbaceous.
Examples for showing are: Achillea, Phlox, Scabiosa, Coreopsis, Gaillardia, Sidalcea, Thalictrum, Gypsophilla, Rudbeckia and Helenium. All are in flower around show time.

## Consititution and Management Rules

The Society shall be named the Benholm \& Johnshaven Horticultural Society. Its objects shall be the encouragement of horticulture grown in the Show area; home baking, preserve making, etc.; membership being confined to the village of Johnshaven and the Parish of Benholm, being bound by the Lauriston Den on the south side.

The Committee of the Benholm \& Johnshaven Horticultural Society shall be elected at the AGM every two years.
The Committee openly welcomes both existing and all new members from the Benholm \& Johnshaven Community Area who are willing to support and maintain the activities and objectives of the Society.
The Committee shall comprise a maximum of 16 members, including Management and Office Bearers as stated in Article 4 of the Constitution.

After fifteen consecutive years service, Committee members shall be granted Life membership and presented with Scrolls on Show Days.
The Society Management shall be vested in a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer with a Committee of not less than twelve elected at the AGM of the Society, seven being a quorum and the President having a deliberative and casting vote.

The Treasurer's books shall be audited before the Annual General Meeting.
6 A Sub-Committee may visit the gardens of Members at any time previous to the show.
7 The Annual Garden Competitions shall be classified as "OPEN", meaning open to all Residents in the Community of Benholm and Johnshaven whether Members or Non-Members of the Society. Members of the Committee (who are not entering the competition) will tour the community during the first week of July, identify gardens deemed suitable for competition entry and invite the owners to enter the competition.
8 All Cups and Trophies competed for annually are insured by the Society against all risks and the Secretary must be notified immediately in the event of any Cup or Trophy being damaged, lost or destroyed.
9 No alteration in the Constitution and Management Rules shall be made except at the AGM. Public notification of proposed changes to Constitution and Management Rules must be made fourteen days prior to the AGM.
